Taking Action Now to Protect Our Future

Research studies have shown that maternal and infant mortality rates in the United States rank as among the worst in the developed world. In particular, Black women are more likely to die from pregnancy-related events than their white counterparts, with a related infant mortality rate twice that of their white counterparts.
